Summary of S. 744 'Gang of Eight' Immigration bill with Recommendations

'Gang of Eight' advances:	EBI recommends:
American generosity.	American healing and renewal to sustain generosity.
An influx of foreign labor.	Hire 20 million unemployed Americans. E-verify.
Influx of 12,000,000 citizens now and 30,000,000 over ten years.	Slower and more gradual, sustainable immigration.
The leverage of powerful lobbyists. Funding from NIF/Soros globalists.	The view of 72% of all likely American voters, and approx. 80% of evangelicals (Pulse Research 2013)
Ignore first principles; documents.	Do justice to Scripture and our founding principles.
Globalism and multiculturalism.	Indigenous culture and sovereignty first. Assimilate. Teach American history, values and language.
A larger welfare state.	Citizens who are productive and prosperous are more generous to the most needy — the handicapped, elderly and those who cannot work.
Could yield a political monopoly.	Strengthen our two-party democracy and Republic.
More massive legislation without long-term net cost projections.	Do not spend or promise what we have not saved. Net costs over 30 years are in the trillions of dollars.
Easing of asylum for foreigners.	Less asylum and "sanctuary cities" for culturally incompatible values, sleeper cells, drugs and gangs.
Border security later.	Border security first to rebuild trust, law and safety.
